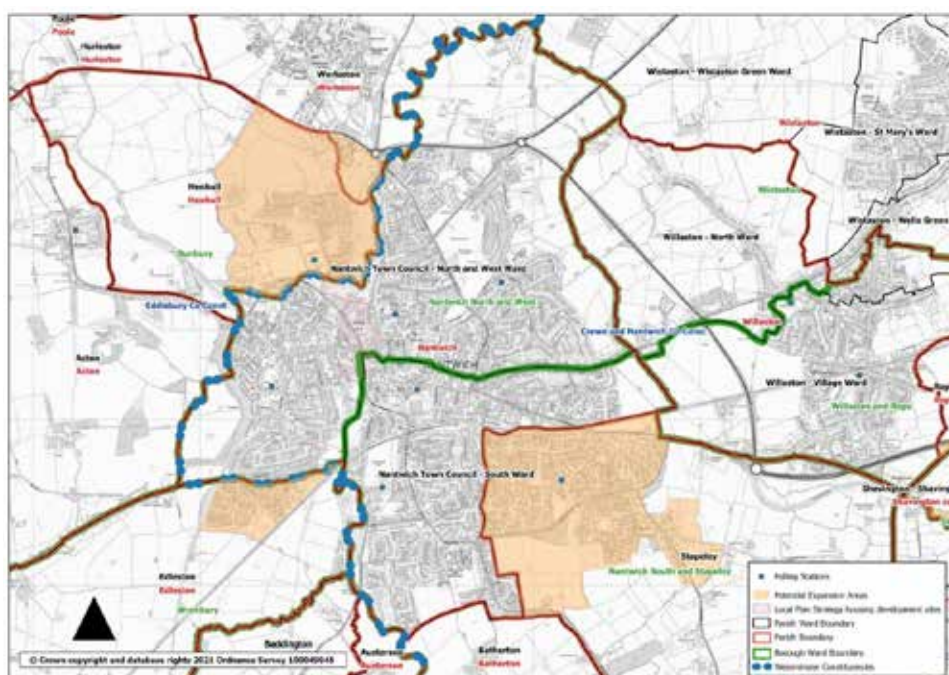

Community Governance Review

Cheshire East Council is holding a 12-week consultation on proposals for the governance arrangements for town and parish councils in the borough.



This is part of a borough-wide review, as Cheshire East is responsible for the governance and electoral arrangements for the borough's 186 town and parish council wards in 135 town and parish councils.

The review looks at a range of issues, including town and parish boundaries, numbers of town and parish Councillors, grouping of parishes and warding. The consultation provides people with an opportunity to comment and make the case for alternative proposals to those recommended.

Queen's Jubilee

In 2022, Her Majesty The Queen will become the first British Monarch to celebrate a Platinum Jubilee, which is seventy years of service. Her Majesty acceded to the throne on 6th February 1952 when she was 25 years old.

The Platinum Jubilee Weekend in June, will include an extended bank holiday, from Thursday 2nd to Sunday 5th June, and will provide an opportunity for communities to come together to celebrate the historic milestone.

The four days of celebrations will include public events and as a town we are hoping to join in with these celebrations. This is where you come in. As a Town Council we have some ideas, but we would like to know what you, the residents of the town would like. Therefore we would love to hear any ideas/suggestions you may have to create a celebration in the Town.

As part of its commitment to local community and voluntary organisations the Town Council offers grants and donations to support local groups, activities and events. There are three different types of grants available including:

Grants up to £500

Applications for small grants up to £500 are invited throughout the year and are awarded subject to budget at the discretion of the Finance Committee.

Grants – £500 – £5,000

Each year the Council has a budget for larger grants and invites applications for projects that meet its grant criteria. The deadline for applications is November for payment in April the following year. This allows the Council to build the commitment into its budget calculations for the next financial year.

A New On-Demand Rural Bus Service To Help Reduce Isolation

Cheshire East Council have launched the new 'go-too' pilot scheme which covers a wide area south of Nantwich, taking in Bunbury, Wrenbury and Audlem and other villages, where no commercial services are available.

The bus service can be booked by anyone via a mobile phone app or phone call, with a doorstep pick-up service for less-mobile passengers. This allows someone, or a group of people, to request a bus for a specific journey.

The service is not tied to a fixed route, allowing for efficient shared trips without lengthy detours or fixed schedules.

The 16-seater 'midi' buses are available between 7am and 9pm, Monday to Saturday, with low-floor access.

Fares for the bus service will be £3 for people aged 16 and over and £2 for under-16s and concessions. For every five journeys taken, users will get the sixth journey free.

Nantwich First Responders

Nantwich Gavin Palin (Emergency Medical Technician First Responder) and Max Kelly (Enhanced First Responder), are from the North West Ambulance Service NHS Trust. They are unpaid volunteers who give their time freely to help and care for people and save lives in our community. Nantwich First Responders provide coverage for Nantwich, Crewe, Audlem, Wrenbury, Wybunbury and all other surrounding areas.

They work on behalf of North West Ambulance Service NHS Trust (NWAS) and attend serious and life threatening 999 calls in and around the community to provide the earliest possible intervention for patients in the first vital minutes until the arrival of an Ambulance.

Gavin has been volunteering his time as a First Responder for the last 21 years and Max for the last 10 years. They are and have been for many years kindly supported by SYNETIQ Ltd (Schofield Brothers Mark, John and Paul), Nantwich Town Council and Reaseheath College Motor Vehicle department.

They have both been active in getting life saving defibrillators available for public use around Nantwich with the support of local people and they get great satisfaction out of helping their community and providing vital skills to those who are in need.

The judges also met representatives from Nantwich Partnership, Nantwich Museum, Litter Groups, St Mary's Church, Reaseheath College, Dementia Friendly Nantwich, Ansa and Nantwich Town Council as well as many Nantwich in Bloom volunteers.
