Nantwich Town Council Receives Award In National Scheme

Nantwich Town Council has received a prestigious award as part of the Local Council Award Scheme. The Council has been accredited as a Quality Gold Council, which is the ultimate achievement in the three-tier Local Council Award Scheme (LCAS) instituted by the National Association of Local Councils (NALC), in collaboration with the UK Government's Department of Levelling Up, Housing and Communities; the Local Government Association and the Society of Local Council Clerks (SLCC).

The Quality Gold Award is evidence based and independently assessed demonstrating that a council is at the forefront of best practice and achieves excellence in governance, community leadership and council development. Quality Gold councils provide leadership for their communities, bringing people together, have excellent business planning processes as well as constantly seeking new innovations and opportunities to improve. They highlight the very best we, as a sector, can achieve for our communities.

Councillor Peter Groves, Mayor of the Council said, "The award and accreditation recognises the dedication and commitment of everyone at Nantwich Town Council in making a difference through what the Council does for and on behalf of the community."

In terms of the future, the Council is now reviewing ways in which it can keep on improving its offer to the local community and welcomes input from local people and partners on this. Nantwich and other local Councils like it, are at the front line of the government's localism agenda and are doing as much as they can to deliver services whilst being efficient and cost-effective. Currently the Council provides a range of services and wants to improve its community engagement through this.





Rural Bus Service To Help Reduce Isolation

Cheshire East Council's 'go-too' scheme covers a wide area south of Nantwich, taking in Bunbury, Wrenbury and Audlem and other villages, where no commercial services are available.

The bus service can be booked by anyone via a mobile phone app or phone call, with a doorstep pick-up service for less-mobile passengers. This allows someone, or a group of people, to request a bus for a specific journey.

The service is not tied to a fixed route, allowing for efficient shared trips without lengthy detours or fixed schedules. The 16-seater 'midi' buses are available between 7am and 9pm, Monday to Saturday, with low-floor access.

Fares for the bus service will be £3 for people aged 16 and over and £2 for under-16s and concessions. For every five journeys taken, users will get the sixth journey free.

Climate Change Seminar Success



Last year Nantwich Town Community stakeholders to develop the town's first Climate Action of the Council and the town. Last year Nantwich Town Council declared a Climate Emergency and since have been working with a group of community stakeholders to develop the town's first Climate Action Plan. The aim of the

The Council and the working group are keen to hear from residents, businesses and key stakeholders in the town, wanting to know what the concerns and priorities of the community are, and what actions the community think could be taken to reduce the carbon footprint. To gain some of this information the group hosted a FREE Climate Seminar, at the Civic Hall in September to enable residents to have an input and to try to establish what the town's priorities should be. The event featured three key speakers who shared their knowledge and experiences on tackling climate change, along with stalls highlighting how to get involved. The audience were then invited to take part in breakaway sessions and given the opportunity to share ideas for actions to be included within the Climate Change Action Plan.

Over 70 people attended the seminar, contributing during the breakaway sessions and providing valuable ideas on how the town can tackle climate change. Some of the feedback received from those who attended the seminar when asked what they liked about the event included:

"I felt the event was very well organised and the speakers covered different topics which were all very interesting."

"The enthusiasm of the participants and awareness of the need to control the climate."

"An opportunity to make one's views known and hopefully to influence and encourage the council to pursue a variety of environmental issues for the good of the town and its people."

The working group will now review all the ideas received and develop the draft Climate Action Plan before consulting with the community.

Coach Friendly Status

Nantwich has again been awarded Coach Friendly Status by the Confederation of Passenger Transport (CPT).



The status is an industry standard designed to recognise and reward attractions that go the extra mile to provide a warm welcome to groups arriving by coach.

Nantwich Town Council supports the scheme by paying for coach parking at the Football Club and providing a meal voucher for the coach driver for use in several cafés in the town, as well as welcoming visitors into the town and providing tourist information.

The Mayor said "We are delighted to have this accreditation renewed and this is one of a number of ways in which the Town Council is looking to support the town's economy and ensure that it continues to provide a varied shopping experience whilst retaining its role as a traditional market town. Hopefully Coach Friendly Status will bring more visitors to Nantwich and encourage people to return for a longer stay."

Nantwich Civic Hall Becomes a Connected Communities Centre

The Connected Communities Social Franchise was launched with the aim to ensure that community buildings were being used to their full extent and that health and wellbeing services were available close to where people lived.





Spring flowering bulbs will be given to all participants to extend their displays during late winter and early spring.

Moving into the autumn we will be clearing out the summer bedding and planting up winter flowering polyanthus, pansies, primulas and violas for winter and spring displays in the town centre and on Nantwich Railway Station.

We will soon be holding an unveiling ceremony for the new sign at Lakeside Community Copse to commemorate all those in the local community affected by the Covid 19 pandemic.
