## MINUTES OF THE ANNUAL MEETING HELD ON 24<sup>TH</sup> MAY 2018.

<u>Present</u> - Councillor Butterill (Mayor) and Councillors Bartram, Bostock, Bowyer-Bates, Groves, Hall, Kirkham, Martin, Marren, Moran and the Town Clerk.

Prior to the meeting, the Mayor, Councillor Penny Butterill, made a presentation of cheques to the Mayoral charities for the year, **MacMillan Nurses, Nantwich Museum and Wingate Centre, Wrenbury.** Representatives of the charities thanked the Mayor for her work during the year in raising £5,426 for the charities.

Prayers were led by Reverend Dr Mark Hart.

#### 2. APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

Apologies for absence were received from Councillor Lewis and Councillor Simpson.

## 3. ELECTION OF MAYOR

It was proposed by Councillor Moran and seconded by Councillor Martin and **UNANIMOUSLY RESOLVED** that **Councillor David Marren** be elected as Mayor of Nantwich Town Council, to hold office until the next annual meeting of the Council. The new Mayor was invested with the chain of office. Councillor Marren made a formal declaration of office and then took the chair.

Councillor Marren responded to his election by thanking his proposer (Councillor Moran) and seconder (Councillor Martin) for their kind words.

He stated that he was honoured to be chosen and elected as Mayor and promised to continue to do his utmost for the town and its people. Having taken particular interest in building Nantwich as an 'events' town and working with the community in the past, he was humbled to hold this important role and promised to serve with fairness and honesty.

Councillor Marren announced that his wife, Mrs Belinda Marren, would be his consort for the mayoral year. Councillor Butterill invested Mrs Marren with the Consort's Medallion of Office.

## 4. <u>ELECTION OF DEPUTY MAYOR</u>

It was proposed by Councillor Groves and seconded by Councillor Bostock and **UNANIMOUSLY RESOLVED** that **Councillor Arthur Moran** be elected as Deputy Mayor of Nantwich Town Council, to hold office until the next annual meeting of the Council. The Mayor, Councillor Marren, invested the new Deputy Mayor with the medallion of office.

Councillor Moran made a formal declaration of office as Deputy Mayor.

## 5. APPOINTMENT OF CHAPLAIN AND NOMINATION OF MAYOR'S GOOD CAUSES

The new Mayor informed the Council that Reverend Dr Mary Hart, St. Mary's Church, would be his Chaplain for his year of office.

The Mayor named three organisations,

North West Ambulance Community First Responders in Nantwich, Nantwich Fire Cadets, and Hope House Children's Hospice as his good causes for the forthcoming year.

#### 6. VOTE OF THANKS TO RETIRING MAYOR

Councillor Moran proposed a vote of thanks to the retiring Mayor, Councillor Butterill. He referred to the range of duties which Councillor Butterill had undertaken and the many events she had attended. He thanked her for her excellent work during the year in support of the local community, her charities and the Town Council.

Councillor Moran presented a Past Mayor's brooch to Councillor Butterill.

## 7. RETIRING MAYOR'S REMARKS

Councillor Butterill thanked Councillors and her family for their support throughout the year and particularly for the support for her charities. She referred to the many events which she had attended and stated that it had been a great honour and privilege to be Mayor. During her year she had many wonderful people and paid particular tribute to the volunteers who support many of the organisations in the town. She ended by thanking her husband Doug, for his support without which she could not have carried out the role.

## 14.1 GOVERNMENT CONSULTATION ON POWERS FOR DEALING WITH

## **UNAUTHORISED TRAVELLER ENCAMPMENTS**

The Government is to review powers dealing with unauthorised traveller development and encampments and has issued a consultation paper seeking views on

- local authority and police powers
- court processes
- trespass
- planning enforcement
- the provision of authorised sites
- the impacts on the travelling community

The consultation runs until 15th June.

## 14.3 <u>CHESHIRE AND WARRINGTON LOCAL ENTERPRISE PARTNERSHIP – TRANSPORT STRATEGY</u>

Councillor Bostock reported that Nantwich in Bloom had raised £127 from a recent coffee morning and a grant of £150 form Arrival Trains for the station planting. The fruit orchard on the Riverside is now complete.
