46. PUBLIC FORUM

PC Matt Stonier provided a report on the outcome of the vandalism incident on the Square involving damage to a planter. The offenders had paid £100 to Nantwich in Bloom and submitted a letter of apology to the Committee. They will also be involved in some gardening work.

The Food Festival weekend was a great success with no incidents of note. In general anti-social behaviour incidents had reduced in number during the summer.

51.1. Anti-Slavery Awareness Event

An anti-Slavery event is to be held at Nantwich Civic Hall. South Cheshire Chamber of Commerce and Libre Solutions Ltd (not for profit company) are holding the event to raise awareness of modern day slavery and the exploitation of vulnerable people.

The awareness event will take place on the 19th November 2018 starting at 12:30pm. It is a free of charge event and speakers will explain how to recognise the signs of modern slavery and if it is found, how to deal with it, both for residents and local businesses.

At the event, residents and business will receive a presentation from Chamber Members Libre Solutions, who specialise in helping businesses to identify and tackle modern slavery that could be affecting their companies. Their aim is to work with business communities to help them protect and prevent slavery and labour abuse from entering the supply chain.
