Clinically Extremely Vulnerable individuals (as notified by government correspondence advising them to shield at home) are strongly advised to stay at home. Clinically Vulnerable individuals may be able to return to work with additional precautions; these will be assessed on a case-by-case basis and a separate Risk Assessment produced. Correct PPE is worn in line with government guidance and the work we conduct. Good hygiene practices are followed with increased cleaning conducted on all touch points and welfare facilities. Employees with any symptoms are immediately sent home to self-isolate. The number of traders outside will be limited to 23 only to ensure social distancing can be adhered to. There will be three members of staff on duty monitoring to ensure all controls measures are met. One located on the entrance, one on the exit and one patrolling. They will be in constant communication with the use of radios. Signage will be installed in and around the market in inform members of public of our procedures. We will mark out the floor to show 2m distances and the one ways systems in place We are only opening the units up inside during the first week back from lockdown to limit the number of traders and give more space in the hall to social distance. This will be reviewed weekly and we may increase the number of traders if it is safe to do so. Traders must only serve customers from one side as directed by us. There will be no traders allowed to setup on the car park to the Pepper House side of the hall to ensure social distancing can be met. Traders will be allowed to setup from 8am (no public allowed in until 9am) and can bring in stock from the Pepper House side carpark (no vehicles to be parked in this area). Traders failing to comply with this risk assessment, our procedures or directions from our staff will be asked to leave. Staff will wear face shields and will wash hands and use hand sanitizer regularly. Breaks are rotated for market staff so social distancing can be met and staff allocated to the market must not come over to the Civic Hall and should use the welfare facilities at the market. The 2m social distancing rule is adhered to where reasonably possible. We would prefer traders to utilize contactless payments rather than handling cash where possible. The layout of the inside and outside of the hall will be changed so social distancing is adhered to and this will be regularly reviewed. Traders will visit the Civic Hall to pay at a specific time and date as agreed with the facilities manager. The toilets will be locked and will only be open to traders on a one in one out basis who will have to request for them to be open. Market Traders Rules

1. Please use hand sanitiser and wash your hands regularly.
2. No physical contact to be made with any members of the public.
3. Social distancing to be adhere to where possible (unless working the stall with someone from your immediate household).
4. Contactless payments preferred over handling cash.
5. Only serve customers from one side of your stall as directed by us.
6. Our signage, procedures and direction from our staff must be followed at all times.
7. Serve clients quickly to reduce and congestion.
8. If you require the use of the welfare facilities, please speak to a member of staff for access.

Failure to comply with these rules will result in you being asked to leave.
